Nikiti – The Heart of Sithonia

Nikiti is a charming town where modern beach life culture meets traditional Greek

architecture. The old part of the city is located on the hillside and offers stone buildings,

winding alleys, small churches and a timeless atmosphere that feels like stepping back a hundred years in time. The newer part follows the coastline with a stylish promenade filled

with cafes, taverns and bars. Here you can enjoy long walks, delicious fish dishes and

evenings with sea breezes and music.

Halkidiki – Where blue meets green

Halkidiki consists of three peninsulas: Kassandra, Sithonia and Athos – each with its own

personality. Sithonia, where Nikiti is located, is known for its leisurely pace, scenic landscapes, and perhaps the most beautiful beaches in all of Greece. Here, pine forest meets

the sea, creating a unique scent of salty water and pine. The area is perfect for both

adventure and relaxation, and is equally suitable for families with children as well as for

couples and solo travellers.

Nikiti Beach: Ideal for families with shallow water and plenty of cafes and sun loungers.

Koviou Beach: Turquoise waters, soft sand and one of the most photographed beaches in the

Sithonia.

Kalogria Beach: Clear blue lagoon-like beach perfect for snorkeling.

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Lagomandra: Surrounded by pine forest, an ideal beach for those who want both shade and

sun.

Agios Ioannis: A wide and quiet beach where the sunsets are magical.
